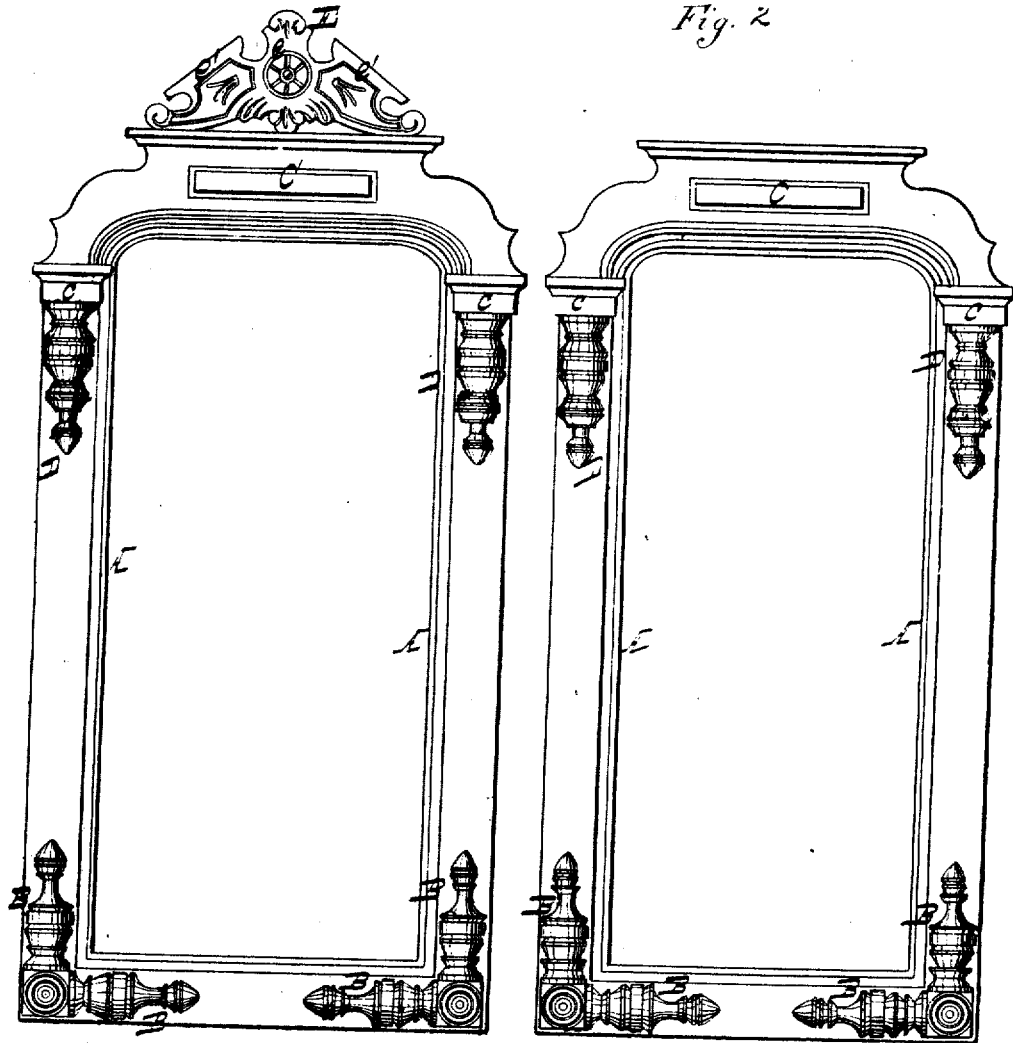

DESIGN FOR A LOOKING-GLASS FRAME.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,446, dated August 15, 1876; application filed May 9, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, R. WESTBROOK MYERS, of New York city, in the county of New York and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Designs for Looking-Glass Frames; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to which it appertains to make and use the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to letters of reference marked thereon, which form a part of this specification, and in which—

Figure 1 is a front view of my improved design for looking-glass frames; and Fig. 2, a similar view thereof, less the configuration of the detachable head-piece.

The nature of this design consists of ornamental or configurated triangle-pieces in the lower corners of the frame, and pendants in its upper part, with or without a configurated mounting for its head-piece.

In the annexed drawing, A refers to a looking-glass frame, in the lower corners of which are ornamental or configurated triangle-pieces B B, and depending from capitals *e e*, at the base of the arched or other-shaped head-piece C of the frame, are ornamented or configurated

pendants D D. Upon the head-piece C is an ornamental mounting, E, in the center of which is inscribed a circle, *e*, upon either side of which is disposed a tapering or other-shaped figure, *e' e'*. This mounting is detachable from the head-piece C of the frame.

Having thus described my design, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design herein described for looking-glass frames, consisting of the frame A, with the ornamental or configurated triangle-pieces B B in its lower corners, and ornamental pendants D D in its upper portion, as set forth.

2. The design herein described for looking-glass frames, consisting of the frame A, having the ornamented triangle-pieces B B in its lower corners, and the ornamented pendants in its upper portion, and its head-piece C, provided with the configurated mounting E *e e'*, as set forth.
