

DESIGN FOR A FAN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,448, dated August 15, 1876; application filed March 14, 1876.

[Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH T. ROWAND, Jr., of Camden, in the county of Camden and State of New Jersey, have invented a certain new and useful Design for Fans; and do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a view of one side of the fan.

Fig. 2 is a view of the other side.

My design is intended to provide a "Centennial" fan; and consists in the pictorial illustrations applied to the leaf, as hereinafter described and claimed.

A in the accompanying drawing represents the leaf of a fan made according to my design, and B the handle. Said leaf is shaped to represent a shield, on which is illustrated, on one side, a view of Old Liberty Bell in Independence Hall, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The other side is provided with pictorial illus-

trations of the two flags, a and b, over which are the figures 1776 and 1876, respectively. In addition thereto the same side of the leaf is illustrated with a view of the seal of the United States, shown at c by a circle, and views of the seals of the thirteen States which first formed the Union, represented by the smaller circles d d.

I claim—

1. The design for a fan, consisting of a shield-shaped leaf, bearing a pictorial representation of the "Old Liberty Bell," substantially as shown.

2. The design for a fan, substantially as shown in the accompanying drawing, consisting of a view of the flags a and b, and seals c d, as described.
