DESIGN FOR CARPETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,453**, dated August 22, 1876; application filed August 4, 1876.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED HEALD, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a Design for a Carpet-Pattern, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a carpet-pattern is shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, and comprises two essential features, A and B. The feature A comprises a group of leaves and stems, the main leaves *a* and *b* of the group containing sprays with smaller leaves. The feature B comprises a central group of leaves, *d*, and surrounding leaf-work *e*, and sprays *f*. The groundwork is composed mainly of sprays formed by line-work, and in-

terspersed over the groundwork are small leaves *g*.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—

The design for a carpet-pattern, substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying drawing.
