DESIGN FOR A SLEEVELESS JACKET.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,455, dated August 22, 1876; application filed August 10, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE F. HOLLIS, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Sleeveless Jacket for a Campaign Uniform, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, making part of this specification, in which are represented front and rear views of the uniform.

In the photographs, *A* represents a sleeveless jacket, and *a b* the two portions which form the front thereof, these portions being cut plain, and having their lower corners *c c* rounded, as shown. *d* is the collar, and *e e* are wings projecting from the shoulders. *f* is

the back of the jacket, upon which is stamped or printed a pictorial representation, which may, however, be omitted, if desired, the design thus produced being neat and unique.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a sleeveless jacket, composed essentially of the rounded front corners *c c* and wings *e e*, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
