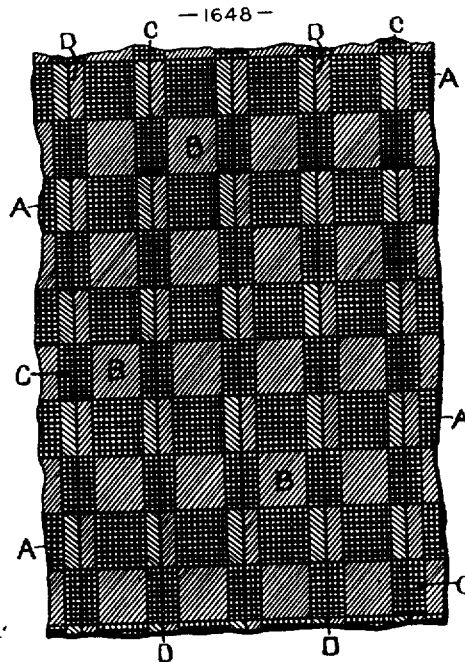

ROBERT SCOTT AND AARON JEWELL, OF LAWRENCE, MASSACHUSETTS.

## DESIGN FOR FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,468**, dated August 22, 1876; application filed August 4, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that we, ROBERT SCOTT and AARON JEWELL, both of Lawrence, in the county of Essex and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new Design for Fancy Worsted or Woolen Fabrics; and we do hereby declare that the following specification, taken in connection with the drawing making a part of the same, is a full, clear, and exact description thereof.

The design which is the subject of this patent consists in the combination of squares and double parallelograms, as hereinafter described.

The squares A are of so-called "basket-weaving" pattern, and are arranged in alternation longitudinally with squares B, which are shaded by diagonal lines. The double parallelograms C are of basket-weaving pattern, and alternate longitudinally with double parallelograms D, shaded by diagonal lines arranged in "herring-bone" fashion. A longitudinal line or succession of squares alternates with a line or succession of double parallelo-

grams, and the squares and parallelograms are so arranged in lateral lines that the parallelograms of basket-weaving separate squares which are shaded by diagonal lines; and parallelograms shaded by diagonal lines separate squares of basket-weaving, as shown.

The fabric may be woven in any preferred variety or combination of colors for giving effect to the design above described, the distinctive feature of which is the combination of squares and parallelograms of basket-weaving and diagonal shading alternating longitudinally and transversely, as described and shown.

What we claim is—

The design for fancy worsted or woolen fabrics, substantially as herein described, and represented in the drawing.
