DESIGN FOR CENTER-PIECE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,474**, dated August 29, 1876; application filed May 22, 1876.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SAMUEL KELLETT, of the city and county of San Francisco, State of California, have invented a new and original Design for a Center-Piece, of which the following is a specification:

My design is illustrated in the accompanying photograph, which represents a face view of design.

This design is composed of simple forms, circular and numbered, as follows: No. 1, drop of center on plain ground; No. 2, diamond-string course, with bead-moulding around; No. 3, guilloche; No. 4, turned beads in sink-

age. A plain molding occupies space between turned beads and outer border. No. 5, leaf with scrolled bands on sides; No. 6, rosette on circular ground. These two last-described forms alternate and make complete border of center-piece.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a center-piece, as shown and described.
