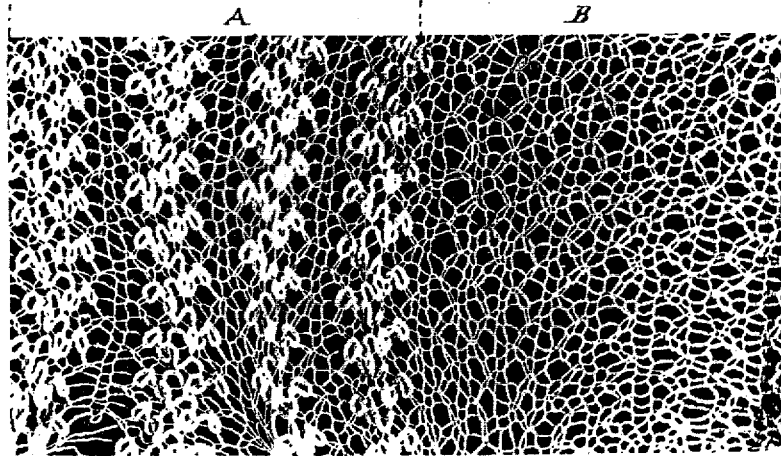

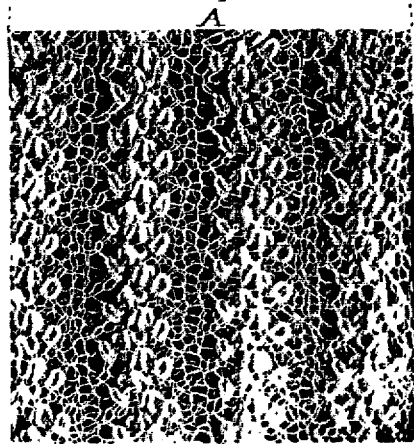

## DESIGN FOR NUBIAS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,478**, dated August 29, 1876; application filed June 17, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, JAMES PHIPPS, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a Pattern for Nubias, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, in which—

Figure 1 represents the nubia opened out, to show the figured front and plain back; and Fig. 2, the appearance of the nubia when the front and back are folded together.

My design consists of a double-ribbed nubia, made in two parts, one of which is plain knitted work, and the other figured on the face.

The part A, which is the front or face of

the fabric, is figured with heavier threads, representing loops intertwined with the knitted work. These loops are arranged to form strips, running lengthwise with the fabric, at an equal distance apart, with the double-rib stitch showing between them.

The part B, which forms the background, consists entirely of plain knitted work, and is folded to give a heavier appearance to the figured part A.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a nubia, with a background of plain knitted work, and the front or face figured with heavier threads, representing small loops intertwined with the knitted work, and arranged to form parallel strips lengthwise with the fabric, as shown and described.
