

DESIGN FOR FLOOR OIL-CLOTH.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9.481, dated August 29, 1876; application filed August 18, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Joseph Robley, of the city of Brooklyn, Long Island, county of Kings and State of New York, have invented or produced a new and original Design for a Pattern to be Printed upon Floor Oil-Cloths or other Carpeting, in colors similar to those painted on the drawings accompanying this specification, or in other colors substituted in place of those painted on the drawings herewith; and I do hereby declare that the drawings accompanying this specification do give and convey to any one skilled in the art of manufacturing floor oil-cloth a thorough description of the nature of my invention, and

are sufficient to enable any one skilled in the art of manufacturing floor oil-cloths to use my invention.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The configuration of the design hereunto annexed, as adapted to be wrought upon floor oil-cloth or other carpeting, in the form similar to the drawings accompanying this specification.
