

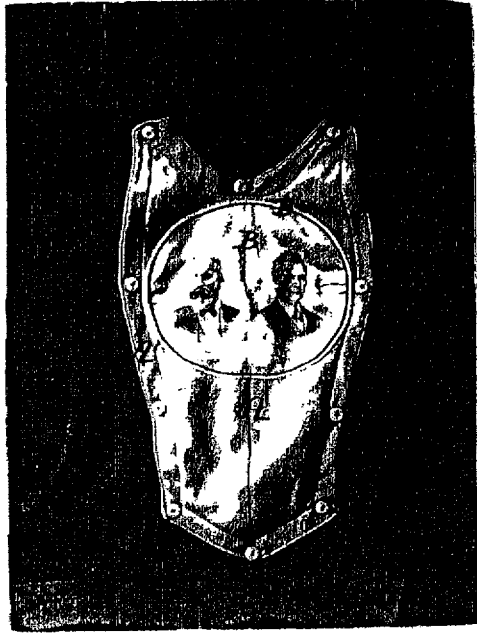

## DESIGN FOR A SHIRT-FRONT.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,482, dated August 29, 1876; application filed August 7, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, SAMUEL STEINWEG, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated and invented a Design for Lapels or Fronts of Shirts, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design will be fully explained by reference to the accompanying specification and photograph, in which—

A represents the lapel, bosom, or front of a shirt, which is formed, as shown, somewhat in the shape of a shield, with a stitched border, A', extending around the edge of the same. B is an oval-shaped medallion, with a border, B', arranged in the upper part of the shirt-front A, and intended for the reception of fancy pictures or individual portraits, as may be desired.

I have represented those of Rutherford B. Hayes and William A. Wheeler, the republi-

can candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States of America; but those of Samuel J. Tilden and Thomas A. Hendricks, or other distinguished citizens, may be substituted without departing from the essential character of my design.

I prefer to make the ground of the medallion B yellow, with a blue border or band, B'; but I do not consider the colors selected to be an essential element of my design.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new is—

The design for a shirt front or bosom, the main portion A of the form shown, with a border, A', and having an oval-shaped medallion, B, containing pictures surrounded by a raised border, B', substantially in the manner above described.
