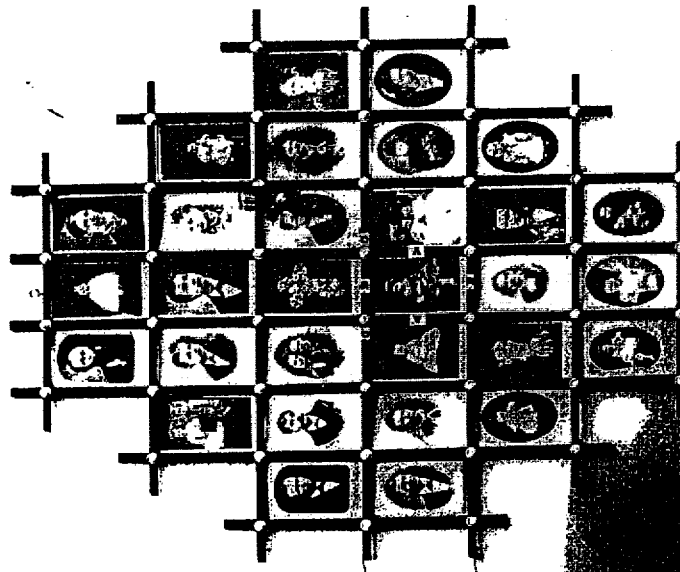
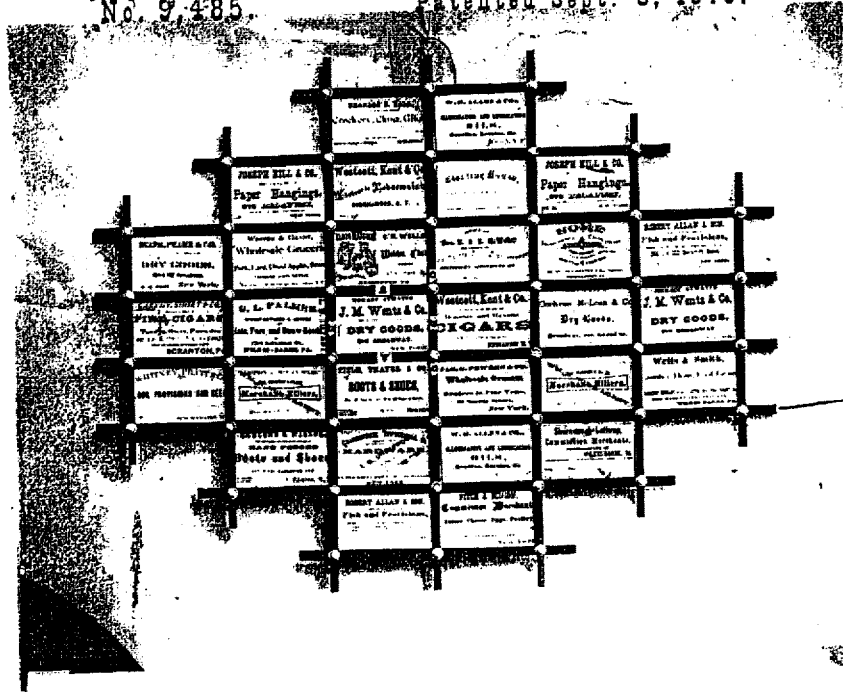

DESIGN FOR A PICTURE-FRAME.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,485**, dated September 5, 1876; application filed March 23, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALONZO GRIFFIN, of Meshoppen, of Wyoming county, State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for a Picture or Card Frame, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A A represent a series of slats placed apart from each other, and running in one direction; B B, a series of slats similarly placed running

in the opposite direction, or at right angles thereto, the two sets forming picture-spaces C, and leaving their ends projecting, as shown at D, such end projections presenting the distinguishing feature of the design.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a picture-frame composed of cross-slats A and B, with the projecting ends D, and the picture-spaces C, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
