

DESIGN FOR STREET-LAMPS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9.488, dated September 5, 1876; application filed August 26, 1876.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE D. BURTON, of New Ipswich, in the county of Hillsborough and State of New Hampshire, have originated and Designed à Pattern for Street and Park Lamps, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration or drawing, making part of this specification.

or drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration,

to which reference is made.

The post is composed of an enlarged base part, a, above which is a smaller vertical part, b, preferably octagonal; but it may have a greater or less number of flat or plane sides. At the top of the post is a cap, c, from which projects an overhanging curved arm, d, from

the lower and free end of which depends a chain, e, made fast to the outer portion of a bracket, f, adapted to receive and hold the lamp g, the inner portion of the bracket being provided with projections h, to be guided by the part b of the post. The lamp occupies a position substantially under the center of the arch. The shape of the lamp g may be varied.

I claim-

A design for street and park lamps, composed of the upright post with enlarged base, the arched arm, the chain, the bracket, and a lamp placed below the arch, all substantially as shown and described.
