## DESIGN FOR A COAT.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,490**, dated September 5, 1876; application filed August 19, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, FREDERICK KELLOGG, of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Designs for Campaign Uniforms, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of the present invention will be fully comprehended by reference to the accompanying photographic illustration.

A represents a blouse, whose front, at B B and C C, is formed of material of a different color from the main part of the garment, the style thereof being in imitation of the Continental coat, while at the same time the blouse fully covers the front of the body. The blouse

is also provided with sleeves of a Continental pattern, as shown. I am not particular as to the color of the parts, only that the distinction as stated be made in the parts B C, so that the part A resembles a Continental coat, while all the parts form a blouse.

I claim as new—

The design for a coat, formed of the parts A, B, C, and S, as described and shown in the accompanying illustration.
