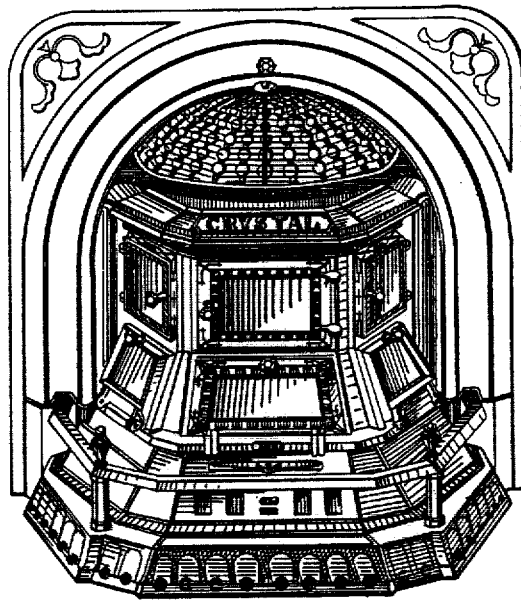

DESIGN FOR STOVES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,491**, dated September 12, 1876; application filed August 25, 1876.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, AMOS C. BARSTOW, of Providence, Rhode Island, have originated or invented a new Design for Stoves, of which the following is a specification:

This design relates to stoves known as fire-place heaters, and is illustrated in the accompanying drawing.

The stove has a hexagonal or irregular octagonal form, with flat or plane surfaces, instead of a rounded surface. It is most extended at the base, and thence gradually contracts until the upper door is reached. One of the flat faces of the stove forms the front thereof. The details of the design will be gathered from the drawing.

The several parts of the stove may be variously ornamented; but the characteristic feature of my design resides in the above specified configuration of the stove-body.

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for fire-place heaters herein described and shown.
