DESIGN FOR BOTTLES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,495, dated September 12, 1876; application filed September 2, 1876 [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE W. SHEDD, Jr., of Boston, State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and Improved Bottle, of which the following is a specification:

Th nature of my invention is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustra-

tration, to which reference is made.

The object of the invention is to provide a neat and striking design for a bottle for Cologue or other purposes; and the design consists of a rimmed cylindrical base part, a tapering neck with panels, and a smooth top or crown part of the neck.

Similar letters of reference indicate corre-

sponding parts.

A represents the cylindrical base part, which has a bottom and top rim, a. top rim a connects by a slight bulge with the tapering neck B, that forms panels, on which the firm, name of the article placed in the bottle, trade-mark, &c., may be molded. The upper end of the paneled neck part communicates again by a bulging rim, b, with the slightly-tapering and smooth top or crown part C of the neck, into which the cork is inserted.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Pat-

1. The design for a bottle composed of a cylindrical base part, tapering and paneled neck part, and smooth top or crown part above paneled neck, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design for a bottle in which the middle, tapering, or neck part is paneled and connected with the base and top parts by bulging rims, substantially as shown and described.
