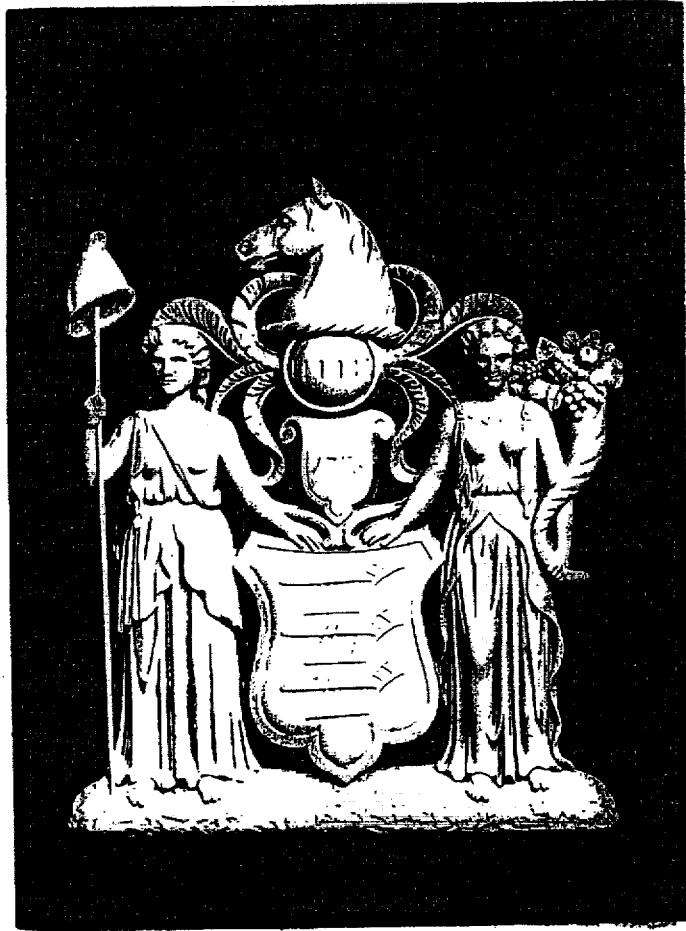

DESIGN FOR A BASS-RELIEF.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,506**, dated October 3, 1876; application filed July 12, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, AUGUST CARLEWITZ, of the city of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have originated and produced a new Design for a Bass-Relief, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification, and which fully represents the nature and character of my design.

My design consists in the two draped female figures, standing erect, one holding an upright staff, surmounted with the cap of liberty, and the other a horn of plenty, representing liberty and prosperity, each with one hand resting upon a shield placed between them, upon which are representations of rude agricultural implements. Above the larger shield is a

smaller shield, bearing the number 1776, the whole being surmounted with a horse's head and neck and ornament, combined therewith, all essentially as shown and represented in the accompanying illustration, thus embodying, in the grouping of the figures, their positions, forms, drapery, &c., a new and original design.

I therefore claim as my invention—

The design for a bass-relief, composed of the draped female figure, holding the staff and cap, and cornucopia, the shield, the horse's head, and the intermediate shield, and number thereon, all as described.
