

DESIGN FOR A TOY CANDY-BOX.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,535, dated October 3, 1876; application filed July 12, 1876. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JACOB HIENER, of the city and county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated a new and useful Design for a Toy Candy-Box, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, making part of this specification, in which-

Figure 1 is a side view. Fig. 2 is a bottom

view. Fig. 3 is a front view.

My invention consists of a design for a toy candy-box, for purposes of bonbons, &c., of the

form of a fireman's hat.

Referring to the drawings, A represents the body of the hat, and B the rim thereof. C represents the shield in front of the body A, and D the holder for the top thereof, said holder being of the form of the head and neck of an eagle. To the body A there is attached a bag or sack, E, which depends from the body and constitutes a continuation of the interior

thereof, the body and bag thus providing a receptacle for confectionery, which will be retained therein by gathering or tying the mouth

of the bag.

On the face of the shield D there are the figures and words "1776, American Fire Department, 1876," which are suggestive of the one-hundredth anniversary of American Independence, and the coming parade, in the city of Philadelphia, of the fire departments of the country.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a toy candy-box, the same consisting of the hat body and rim A B, shield C, with the words and figures "American Fire Department, 1776, 1876," holder D, and suspended bag E, as shown and described.
