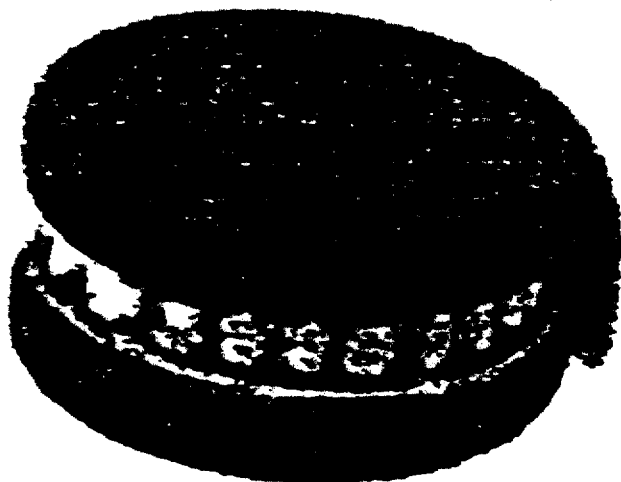

DESIGN FOR CARAMELS OR CANDY-DROPS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,574**, dated October 3, 1876; application filed August 29, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE S. COLLUM, of Hartford, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have originated a Design for Caramels or Candy-Drops, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

My design consists in two disks having

plain circumferences, united by a neck or disk of smaller diameter, having an indented or scalloped edge.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a caramel or candy-drop, composed of two disks, united by a smaller disk with indented or scalloped edges, substantially as herein described.
