


DESIGN FOR BRACELETS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,579, dated October 3, 1876; application filed September 14, 1876. [Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES WILKINSON, of Mount Vernon, in the county of Westchester and State of New York, have originated and Designed a Pattern for Bracelets, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

In said drawing, Figure 1 represents a side view of my bracelet. Fig. 2 is a plan of the

same when unrolled.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts. This invention relates to the design for an open-work bracelet composed of a series of parallel bars, which are connected by diamondshaped filling pieces.

In the drawing, the letter A designates my

bracelet, which consists of a series of parallel bars, a, which are connected by diamond-shaped filling pieces b. By this combination a bracelet is obtained which has a new and ornamental appearance.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is—

The design for an open-work bracelet composed of parallel bars a and diamond-shaped filling pieces b, as shown and described.
