

DESIGN FOR A BADGE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,583, dated October 10, 1876; application filed September 22, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, VINCENT FOUNTAIN, Jr., of West New Brighton, in the county of Richmond and State of New York, have invented a certain new and useful Design for a Campaign-Badge; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, which form part of this specification.

My invention relates to a design for a campaign-badge, as will be more fully described in the accompanying specification and drawing, which illustrates the same.

a represents a ring that is broken apart, and in which is placed the figure of a man, c, who stands with both arms raised above his head, grasping the ring with his hands on each side of the break. On the ring may be inscribed the words "Ring Breaker," or any others that may be preferred. The figure of the man is here preferably represented as Saml. J. Tilden, of New York, and the design is intended to represent him as a ring-breaker.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a campaign-badge, consisting of a broken ring and the figure of a man within it, represented in the act of breaking the ring, as shown in accompanying drawing.
