## DESIGN FOR PAPER BOXES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,588, dated October 10, 1876; application filed August 9, 1876.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN E. TAYLOR, of Springfield, in the county of Hampden and State of Massachusetts, have originated and produced a new and original Design for Paper Boxes for Stationery, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The top of the box is highest in the middle and inclines downward toward each side, giving the box, at the upper part, a form similar to the roof of a house, and an ornamental vertical border projects down all around from

the upper edge, and the horizontal edges of the top slightly project over the vertical sides of the body of the box, all which is clearly shown in the photographic illustration.

What I claim as my invention is—
A paper box for stationery, with the top thereof highest in the middle and inclining

A paper box for stationery, with the top thereof highest in the middle, and inclining forward toward each side, and with an ornarental vertical border projecting down all around from the upper edge, all as herein shown and described.
