DESIGN FOR BELLS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9.589, dated October 10, 1876; application filed October 14, 1875.

[Term of Patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN J. LYNCH, of Washington, in the county of Washington, and in the District of Columbia, have invented a certain new and original Design for Hand-Bells; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification.

The distinctive feature of my design consists in a bell, A, which has the form and configuration of the old "Independence Beli," and is surmounted by a figure, B, which rep-

resents the Goddess of Liberty, and has such relative size and proportion as to render it suitable for a handle.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim as new is—
