DESIGN FOR A STATUE OF WASHINGTON.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,594, dated October 24, 1876; application filed June 21, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JETHRO B. CRAWFORD, of the city of Rochester, in the county of Monroe and State of New York, have originated and designed a Statue of George Washington, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The characteristic features of my design are, first, the arrangement of the cloak, which falls down the right arm to the wrist, thence to the base of the statuette. On the other side it passes down the left arm, being disposed in folds at the elbow, thence falling down to the base, and, by its connection with said base, strengthening the statue. Second, the left arm is so placed as to bring the hand on the

breast. In said hand is a scroll, intended to represent the Declaration of Independence. Third, the right arm is brought forward, with the hand resting on a sword.

The position of the head, body, and limbs I do not claim.

What I claim is—

A design for a statue, consisting of a representation of George Washington, having his left hand pressed against his breast, and holding a scroll, his right hand resting on a sword, and his cloak depending from his arms and connecting with the base, all as herein shown and described.
