

## DESIGN FOR A BOA.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,599, dated October 24, 1876; application filed June 19, 1876.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MORITZ FREYTAG, of the city of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have originated and designed a Pattern for Boas, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration or drawing, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustra-

tion, to which reference is made.

The figure represents one-half of a boa, in which A represents the sides or edges; B, the dark-colored stripes; C, the lighter-colored center strip or stripe, and D the tails. The body is made up of light and dark colored furs, so as to consist of five parallel stripes—three light, and two of darker color, as shown. The central stripe C may be darker than the side or edge stripes A. All of the colors used will

vary according to the colors of the furs used, as when the stripes B are black the stripes A C may be quite dark. Two tails, D, one for each dark or black stripe, will give the best finish to the boa; but a single tail may be used, if desired.

I am aware that boas with a single dark stripe through the middle are not new, and I do not claim them. The distinctive character of my design is found in the five stripes running lengthwise of the body, showing two distinct darker lines or stripes, so that one skin makes two stripes in every case.

What I claim as my invention is-

A design for a boa composed of five or more stripes arranged lengthwise, substantially in the manuer described.
