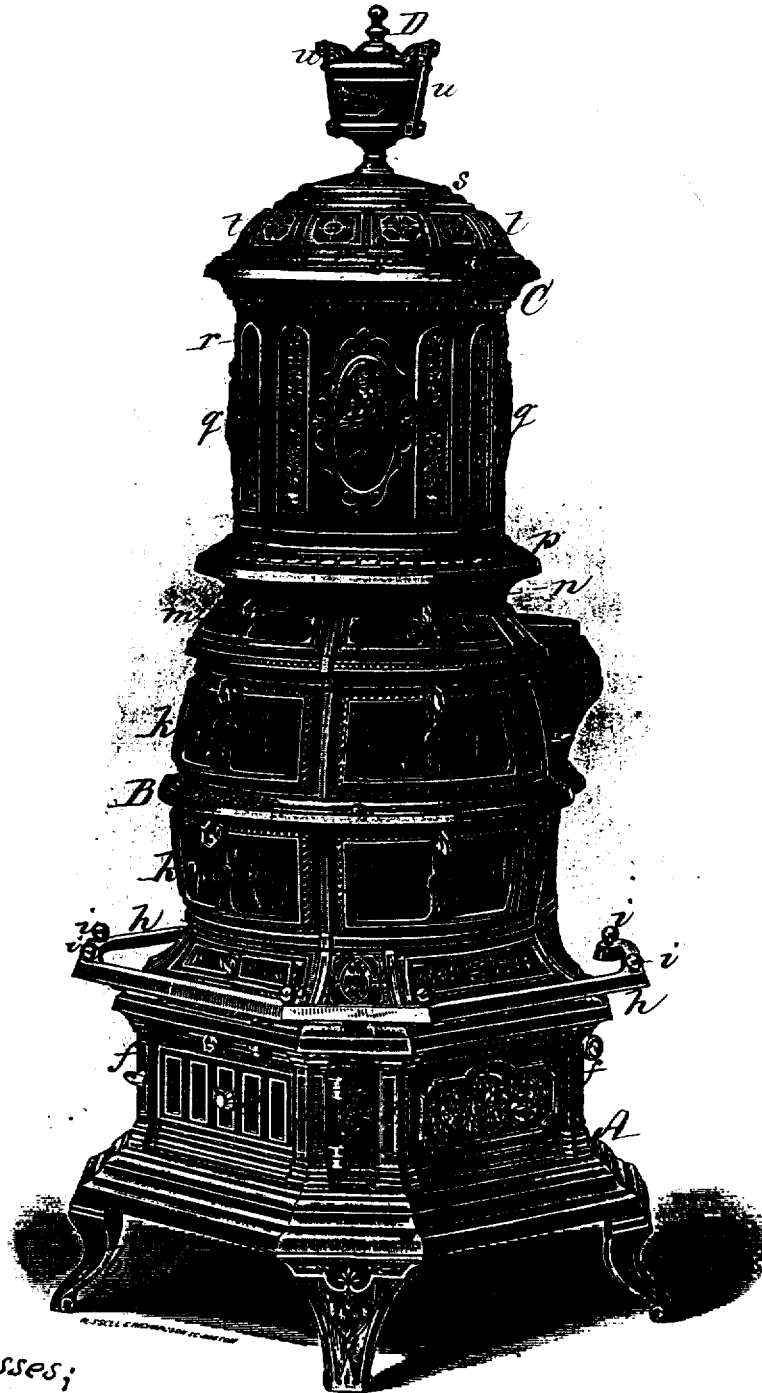

## DESIGN FOR MAGAZINE-STOVES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,601, dated October 24, 1876; application filed September 26, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that we, JOHN MAGEE and FRANK A. MAGEE, of Chelsea, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Base-Burning or Magazine Stove, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying engraving, making part of this specification.

In the engraving, A represents the base of the stove, which is supported on legs *b*, each of which is provided with a sunken panel at the top, and a leaf-ornament extending down therefrom. The base A is of the form of an eight-sided polygon, and is provided on two of its opposite sides with large ornamental panels *c*, containing figures in bass-relief. At the front of the base is a door, *d*, containing the ordinary draft-slide, and at each corner is a small panel, *e*, having on each side a pillar, *f*, and containing an ornamental scroll. Above the base is a curved portion, *g*, having ornamental panels, and around this portion extends a fender or guard-rail, *h*, on the upper surface of which, at the corners, are projections *i*. B is the body of the stove, which is provided, as usual, with six large doors, *k*, each having ornamental panels and a central rosette, *l*. Above the upper doors *k* are three small doors, *m*, located in an offset made to contain them, and above these doors is a curved portion, *n*,

extending up to the base P of the magazine C. This magazine is of cylindrical form, and is embellished with four large panels, *q*, containing fixtures in bass-relief representing the four seasons, or other devices, and between the panels *q* are narrow panels *r*, containing running-vine ornaments, as shown. The top *s* of the magazine C is made in the form of a dome, and is provided with ornamental panels *t*, the dome being surmounted by an urn, D, of tapering form, having handles *u* on opposite sides.

What we claim as our invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design for a base-burning or magazine stove, composed essentially of the base A, portion *g*, body B, and magazine C, with its panels and dome-shaped top, substantially as herein shown and described.

2. The design of the base A, with its pillars *f* and panels *e*, as shown and described.

3. The design of the magazine C, with its ornamental panels, as shown and described.

4. The design of the top *s* of the magazine C, as shown and described.
