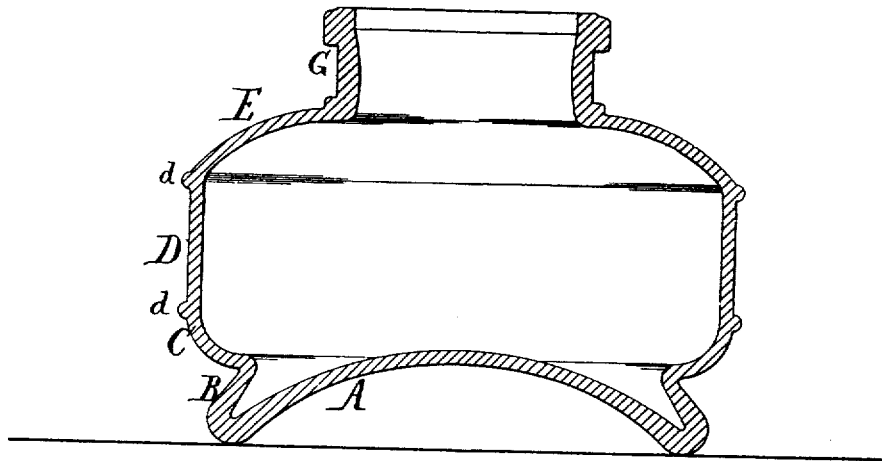

DESIGN FOR INKSTANDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,612**, dated November 7, 1876; application filed October 13, 1876.
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN B. DAVIDS, of New York city, in the State of New York, have originated a Design and Form of Inkstand, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, which forms a part of this specification, and is a central vertical section.

A is the base, lower at the periphery than in the interior. B is a contracting portion immediately above. C is a swell or enlargement; D, a cylindrical surface, which may bear a label, or may be formed with raised or

sunk letters. E is a spheroidal surface above, and G is a neck or rim surrounding the mouth. Beads *d d* bound the cylindrical portion B.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for an inkstand, consisting of the oval base A, contracted portion B, swell C, face D *d d*, spheroid E, and neck G, as specified.
