

DESIGN FOR INKSTANDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,613, dated November 7, 1876; application filed October 25, 1876. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, OTTO F. FOGELSTRAND, of Kensington, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have originated and designed a new Design for an Inkstand, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying engraving, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying engraving, to which reference is made. A represents the base, B the ink-well, and C the pen-rack. The top of the base is substantially square, from which top the flaring sides extend, the upper portion thereof being a quarter round, and the lower portion a cove, with a narrow band dividing said two portions. At the foot of the cove, upon the front side, there is a rounded elevation, extending the whole length of said front side. The lower edge of the base is composed mainly of curved lines, meeting each other at angles in several places. Ornamental scrollwork in relief is placed on the surface of the cove at three sides, and the rounded elevation and lower part of the cove in front. The upper part of the cove in front is ornamented by raised bars, in the form of several inter-secting U's, and small V's intersecting the bottom of the U's, the space inclosed thereby being a diamond-shaped depression, as shown. The quarter-round is ornamented by parallel transverse bars in pairs, and a row of small raised figures between each pair. The pen-

rack C, of the contour shown, projects upward from the back of the base, and has four arms, which extend first laterally and then forward, said arms being capped by upward-projecting caps a a a a, the contour of the upper half of which caps forms the pointed end of a heartshaped figure, and the lower end of an oval figure, as shown. The faces of these caps are ornamented by a raised ledge, which follows the general contour of the caps, except at the base, where they curve inward, thereby forming the general figure of a heart shell. Other small raised ornaments are also added, if desired. Above the upper pair of caps a a the sides of the pen-rack extend upward a short distance, then curve inward and outward in scroll form, the two sides nearly meeting, at which point they are encircled by a ringshaped band and surmounted by a trefoil.

I claim as my invention—

1. In a design for an inkstand, the base A, formed of the quarter-round and cove, and with the rounded elevation in front, all ornamented in relief, substantially as shown and described.

2. In a design for an inkstand, the pen-rack C, capped by a trefoil, scrolls, and ring, and provided with caps a a a a, of the contour shown, and ornamented as shown and described.
