

DESIGN FOR MATCH-SAFES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,619, dated November 14, 1876; application filed October 25, 1876.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, OTTO F. FOGELSTRAND, of Kensington, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have originated and produced a new and original Design for a Match-Safe, of which the following is a clear, full, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying engraving, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying engraving, to which reference is made.

A represents the match-receptacle, and B the bracket or back. The front of the receptacle is bordered by a raised ledge, and the space inclosed thereby is ornamented by a group of oak leaves and acorns on a roughened ground. The contour of the portion of the back which projects above the receptacle is composed of curved lines, the same forming two ogees upon each side, and meeting at a

point on the top. In this back three openings are formed, the same forming the figure of an acorn with a pointed base. The solid portions of the back are ornamented by acorns and leaf-work on a roughened ground.

I claim as my invention-

1. In a design for a match-safe, the design for the front of the receptacle, consisting of the raised border with the space inclosed thereby, ornamented by a group of oak-leaves and acorns on a roughened ground, substantially as shown and described.

2. In a match-safe design, the design for the back, consisting of the double ogee-sided back with acorn-shaped openings formed therein, substantially as shown and described.
