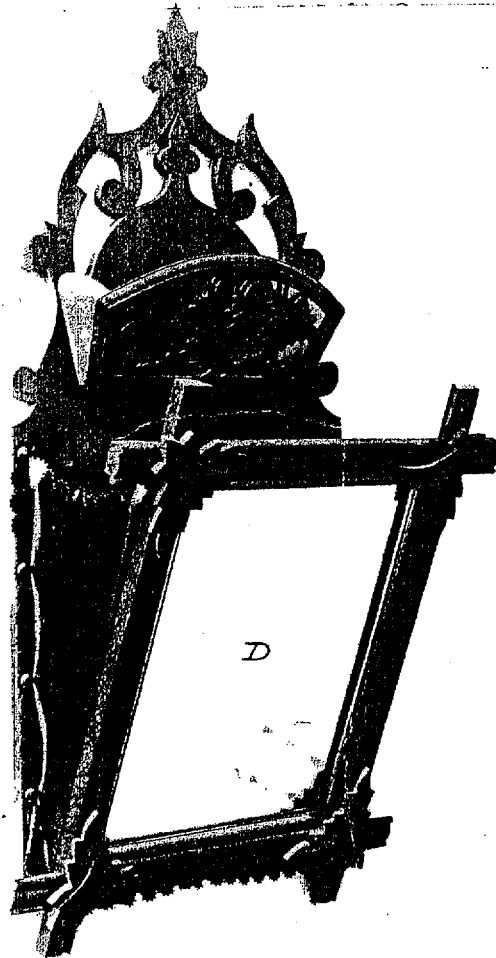

## DESIGN FOR COMBINED WALL-POCKET, MIRROR, AND MIRROR-FRAME.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,645**, dated November 21, 1876; application filed July 31, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, WRIGHT CLAPP, of the city of South Bend, in the county of St. Joseph and State of Indiana, have originated and designed a Pattern for a Combined Wall-Pocket, Mirror, and Mirror-Frame, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration or drawing, making part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

Figure 1 represents a front view of my design; and Fig. 2 a side view, showing the pocket behind the frame.

A represents the back of the wall-pocket, with scroll-work at the top; and B represents a card-receiver or comb-case attached to the

back of the wall-pocket, just above the frame, which is intended to contain a mirror or picture on the front of the wall-pocket; and C represents the frame, intended to contain a mirror or picture, and constituting a part of the front of the wall-pocket; and D represents the mirror, and E represents the sides of the wall-pocket.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a combined wall-pocket, mirror, and mirror-frame, consisting of the scroll-work top A, comb-case B, mirror-frame C, mirror D, and sides E, all substantially as described and shown.
