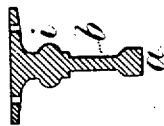

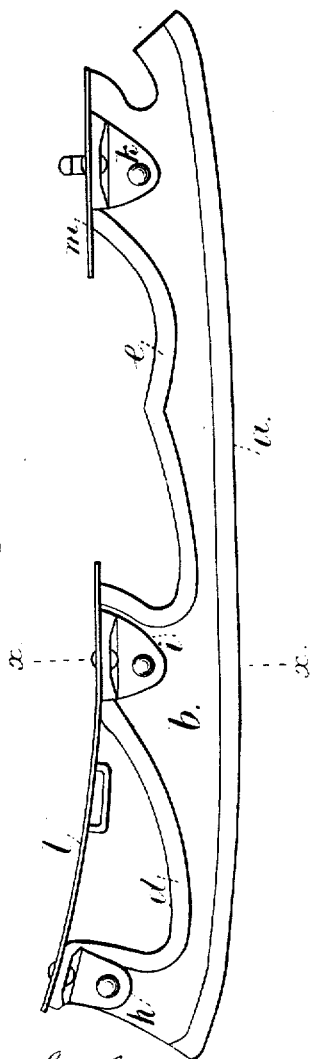
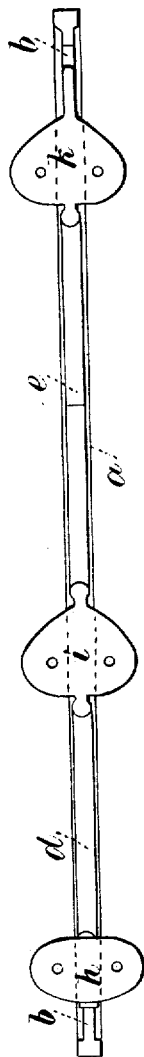

## DESIGN FOR A SKATE-RUNNER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,651, dated November 21, 1876; application filed January 17, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, ACHILLE F. MIGEON, of Wolcottville, in the county of Litchfield and State of Connecticut, have invented or produced a Design for a Skate-Runner, of which the following is a specification:

Skate-runners have been made of cast-steel, and, in some instances, of cast-iron; but the castings have been objectionable in appearance.

My runner is made of the ornamental shape and configuration represented in the drawing, wherein—

Figure 1 is a side elevation. Fig. 2 is a cross-section at the line *x x*; and Fig. 3 is a plan of the runner without the sole and heel plates.

The edge *a* of the runner is of a curved

shape, as usual, and the central portion *b* is a plate, the upper edges of which are curved and ornamented with a rib, as shown at *d* and *e*.

The upper parts of the runner are represented as cast with flanges to receive the sole and heel plates.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a skate-runner, having the configuration shown, the same consisting of a rib at its upper edge, and longitudinal curves *d e*, substantially as described.
