DESIGN FOR A GROUP OF STATUARY.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,653, dated November 21, 1876; application filed October 16, 1876.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN ROGERS, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for a Group of Statuary, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration,

to which reference is made.

The group consists of four figures, and is called "Weighing the Baby." A lady has taken her baby into a grocer's store to be weighed, and has placed it on the scales which are on the counter. Her hands are extended on each side of the baby to guard it from falling. The grocer is lifting his glasses

with his left hand and looking with wonder at the high weight indicated, which is caused by a boy who is leaning against the counter and pulling down on the scales, so as to increase the weight of the baby.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a group of statuary, representing the figures of a grocer, a lady, a boy, and a baby which is being weighed, substantially as described and shown.
