

## DESIGN FOR HINGES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,660, dated November 28, 1876; application filed October 26, 1876.

[Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH LEGER, of Providence, in the State of Rhode Island, have invented or produced a Design for Hinges, of which the following is a description:

The design is shown in the accompanying drawing, wherein Figure 1 represents the design upon the inner faces of the hinge leaves, and Fig. 2 represents the design upon the

back of the hinge.

The faces of the hinge-leaves are made as sunken panels, in which are the arabesque ornaments representing leaves and tendrils involved. These are in bas-relief, as at a. These arabesque leaflets and tendrils are separate and involved in opposite directions, as shown in Fig. 1. The cylindrical portions of the hinge are also ornamented with the diverging stems and leaflets in sunken panels, as at b. The end ornaments c of the hinge-joint are conical, with a notched base, leaflets upon the conical surface, and a finial at the end, as shown. At the back of the hinge, where the same is ex-

posed, there are sunken panels with leaflet ornaments d in bas-relief, extending from a lozenge or shield.

I claim as my production—

1. The design of the separate arabesque ornaments a, involved in opposite directions, and applied within the sunken panel of the hingeface, as shown in the drawing.

2. The design of the ornaments b in the cylindrical portion of the hinge, as shown in the

drawing.

3. The design of the ornamental tips for the ends of the hinges, as shown at c in the drawing.

4. The design of the leaflet ornaments d, applied within the sunken panel at the back of the hinge, as shown in the drawing.
