

DESIGN FOR GLASS AND EARTHEN WARE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,661, dated December 5, 1876; application filed November 22, 1876. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John E. Heuäcker, of Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for Glass and Earthen Ware, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification, in which drawing—
Figure 1 represents a plan or top view.

Fig. 2 is a transverse vertical section.

Similar letters indicate corresponding parts. This invention relates to a design for a combination-dish of glass, porcelain, or clay, the rim of which is composed of two convex curves, which run into a rectilinear partition, and the outlines of which are united by segmental de-

In the drawing, the letter A designates my dish, which consists of two compartments, separated from each other by a rectilinear partition, a, from the ends of which extend the rims b. The top edges of the partition

and of the rims are convex, as shown in Fig. 2, and the interior line of the rims are composed of curves c and straight lines d, as shown in Fig. 1. At the points where the rims b of the two compartments join each other segmental depressions e are formed, as shown. By these means a combination-dish is obtained which has a novel and distinguishing appearance.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure

by Letters Patent, is-

The design for a combination-dish, A, having a rectilinear partition, a, and rims b, composed of curves c, straight lines d, and segmental depressions e, all as shown and described.
