## DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,665**, dated December 5, 1876; application filed November 13, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, RICHARD SMITH, of the city and county of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented and originated a new and original Design for a Font of Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is clearly shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made; and consists of an outline letter shaded at the right and bottom.

The face of the letter is ornamented by a series of horizontal lines.

In the letter A the cross-line extends beyond the left-hand up-and-down line, and terminates in a flourish. In the letters B, D, E, F, K, L, P, and R the up-and-down line of the letter is concaved upon the left. In the let-

ters H and I the up-and-down lines of the letter are concaved upon the left and right. In the letters U, V, and X the horizontal lines are employed only upon one side of the letter—namely, the left-hand side.

In the figures the design is preserved. The figure 3 has the rounding or ball termination at top and bottom. The figures 5 and 9 have the rounded or ball termination at the bottom, and the figure 6 has the rounded or ball termination at its upper termination.

Having now described my design, what I claim as new is—

The design for a font of printing-types, as shown and described.
