

DESIGN FOR BUSINESS-CARDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,666, dated December 12,1876; application filed November 11,1876.

[Term of Patent 3‡ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN M HUISKAMP, of Keokuk, in the county of Lee and State of Iowa, have invented a new and valuable Improvement in Designs for Business-Cards; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, and to the letters and figures of reference marked thereon.

The nature of my design is fully illustrated in the accompanying drawing, to which reference is made.

A represents the back of an ordinary business-card, on which is printed, in one or various colors, the representation of a sleigh, B, and of a horse in harness, C. The body or floor of the sleigh will have printed thereon an advertisement, as shown in the illustration. The runners and thills of the sleigh will be represented as being in the same plane,

and the thills will have the representation of swans' necks projecting toward each other. The runners will be made in open-work, as shown in the illustration, and a dotted line will be drawn at each side of the sleigh hot tom to fix the line of demarkation between the runners and the said bottom.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is--

A design for the back of a business-card, consisting of the representation of a sleigh and of a horse in harness printed thereon, substantially in the manner described.
