

DESIGN FOR COOKING-STOVES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,677, dated December 19, 1876; application filed November 28, 1876. [Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, NICHOLAS S. VEDDER and FRANCIS RITCHIE, each of the city of Troy, in the county of Rensselaer and State of New York, have jointly invented and produced a new and original ornamental Design for Cooking-Stoves, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying cut, print, or engraving of a cooking-stove having our said new design.

One part of this invention is the design for the border-ornament B, consisting of the series of oblong obtuse-angle link-like parts c, joined together by the four-pointed star-like parts d, all shaped and arranged on a flat or smooth surface, e, so as to appear as represented in

the aforesaid cut.

Another part is the design for the side doors C, consisting of the panel ornamentation A, the border-ornament B, the intermediate molding f, and the outer inclined edge g, all shaped, composed, and arranged substantially as represented in the aforesaid engraving.

Another part is the design for the front firedoor D, consisting of the outer beveled border h, the compound border ornament i, and the illumination-panel j, having the row of

upright oblong rectangular apertures k therein, all shaped and arranged together as shown in the aforesaid cut.

What we claim as our invention is—

1. The design for the border-ornament B, composed of the oblong obtuse-angled linklike parts c and the four-pointed star-like parts d, shaped, combined, and disposed as described and shown.

2. The design for the side doors C, consisting of the panel-ornamentation A, border-ornament B, molding f, and outer edging g, as set forth

3. The design for the front door D, consisting of the parts h, i, j, and k, as shown and

described.
