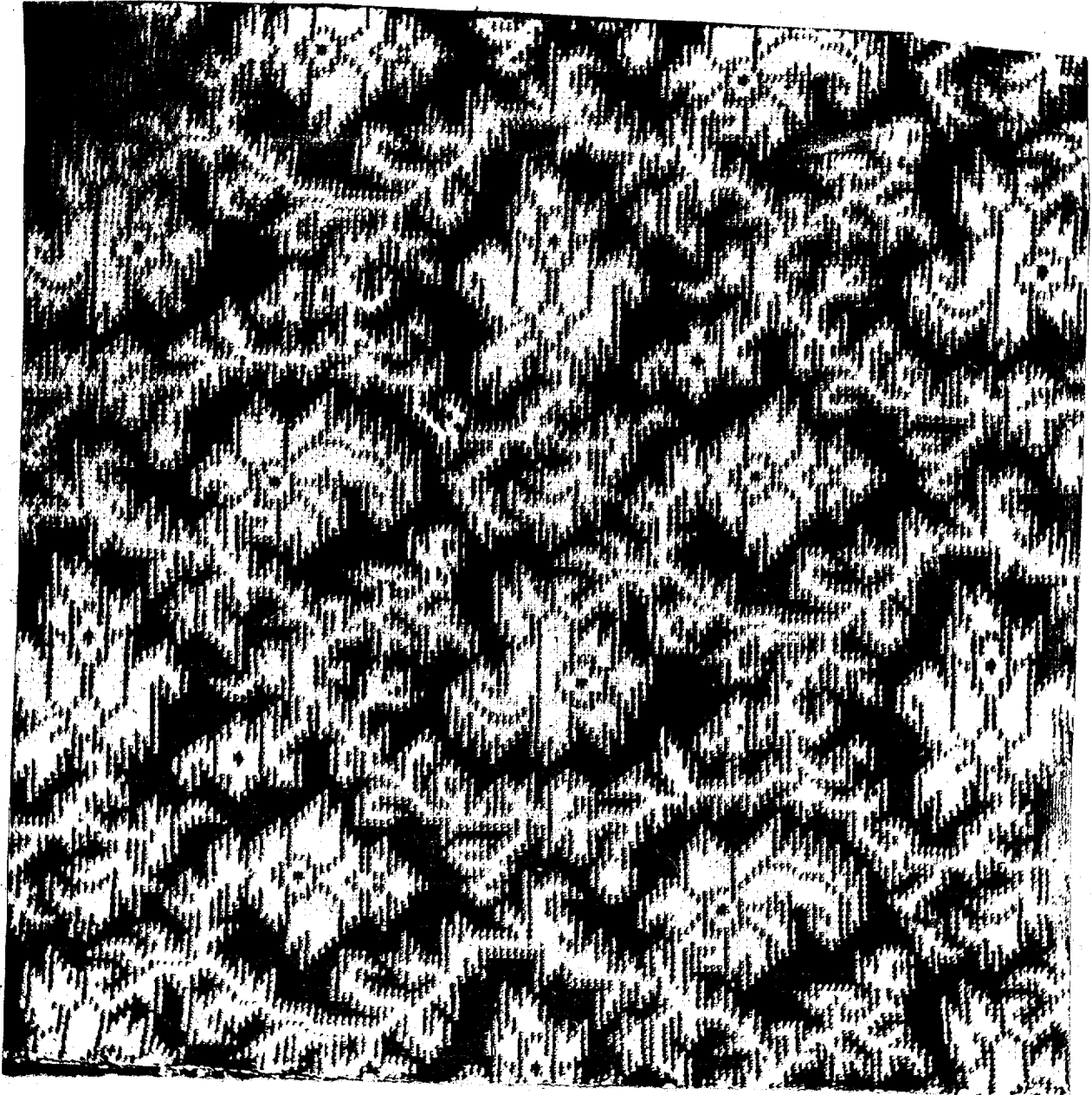

DESIGN FOR CARPET FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,680**, dated December 26, 1876; application filed December 9, 1876
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED HEALD, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a Design for a Carpet Fabric, of which the following is a specification:

My design is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, and consists of scroll-work *a* of a foliated character, the scrolls being so arranged as to inclose spaces containing flower-blossoms *b*, which form part of the foliated scrolls.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—
The design for a carpet-pattern, substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying drawing.
