

DESIGN FOR BOTTLE-STOPPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,683, dated December 26, 1876; application filed November 17, 1876. [Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES R. STEELE, of Waukegan, Lake county, Illinois, have produced or invented a new Design for a Bottle-Stopper, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a bottle-stopper is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, in which-

Figure 1 is a side view, and Fig. 2 an end

view, of the stopper.

The stopper has a tapering stem, a, which is connected by a reduced neck, b, to the head d, which is circular, and has flat parallel sides ff and a curved edge, g, the flat parallel sides joining the neck b and curved edge g abruptly, as shown in Fig. 2, so that the head of the stopper, viewed from the side, as in Fig. 1, has the effect of a narrow ring, forming a continuation of the neck.

I claim-

The design for a bottle-stopper having the stem a, neck b, and circular head d, with curved edge g and flat parallel sides ff, which abruptly join said curved edge and neck, substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying drawing.
