DESIGN FOR A FAN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,692, dated January 9, 1877; application filed June 23, 1876.

[Term of Patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM C. MACBRAIR, of Cincinnati, Hamilton county, State of Ohio, have originated and designed a Pattern for a Fan, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying lithographic illustration making part of this specification:

The nature of my design is fully illustrated in the accompanying lithographic representa-

tion.

It consists of a campaign fan, the opposite sides of which bear the likenesses of the prominent candidates, surrounded by a border in the national colors—red, white, and blue—the blue stripe being dotted with stars. The sides of the fan illustrating my design are respectively provided with the likenesses of Ruther-

ford B. Hayes and William A. Wheeler, the republican nominees for President and Vice-President of the United States. The likeness of other persons will, of course, be used, as occasion may require.

I claim—

The design for a fan, having a border composed of a red, white, and blue stripe, the blue stripe being dotted with stars, and surrounding a portrait in the center, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
