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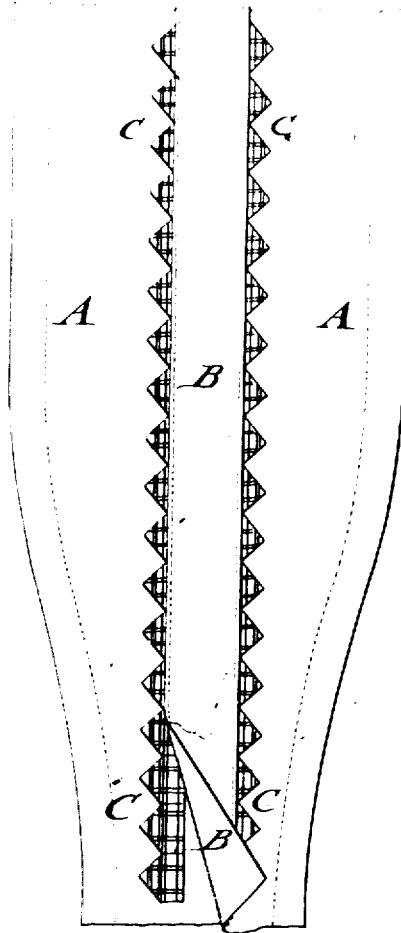

DESIGN FOR A SHIRT-FRONT.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,710**, dated January 16, 1877; application filed December 30, 1876.
[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, SOLOMON WEILL, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Shirt-Front, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

The design relates to an improved ornamental shirt-front; and consists of serrated or scalloped trimmings projecting from one or more edges of the plaits of the front.

In the drawing, A represents a shirt-front, having any suitable arrangement of plaits B, which are ornamented by means of serrated or scalloped trimmings C, that extend from one or more of the plaits B. The trimming C is made of any suitable material, of any

color, and secured between shirt-front and plait.

It imparts a distinctive character to the shirt-front, and may be applied to all kinds of shirts by being attached at one or both edges of the center plait, and also symmetrically thereto to the side plaits, as desired, so as to furnish thereby a large variety of striking designs.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a shirt-front, having plaits with serrated or scalloped trimmings at one or more edges of the plaits, substantially as shown and described.
