

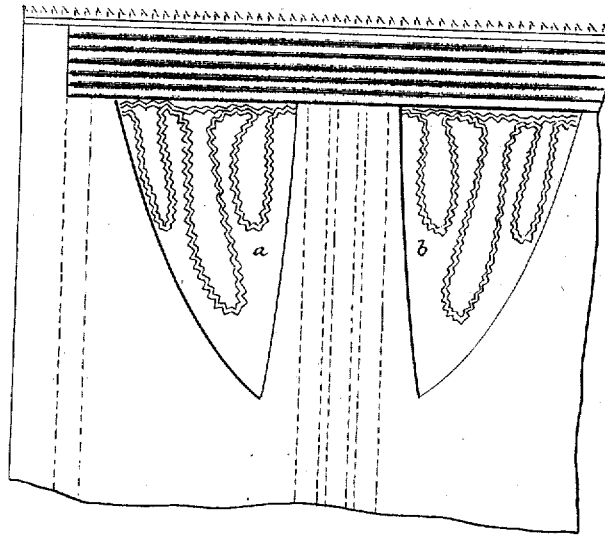

## DESIGN FOR A CORSET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,712**, dated January 23, 1877; application filed December 20, 1876.  
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, MAX ADLER, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Corsets; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a front view of the breast-gores for one side of a corset.

This invention relates to an ornamental design for the breast-gores for corsets; and consists in the peculiar configuration of the ornamentation, as shown in the accompanying illustration and hereinafter described.

The breast-gores are represented by the parts *a b*. Each of these parts is ornamented

by a double line of zigzag stitches across the gore, near the top, running down near the center of each gore in the form of a long loop, and with a shorter loop formed at each side of the said central loop, as shown in the accompanying illustration.

The zigzag lines are formed by perforations at each angle, with thread running from one angle to another, as shown.

I claim—

The ornamental design for the breast-gores of corsets, consisting in a triple-loop-shaped figure, formed with zigzag stitches, as herein described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
