

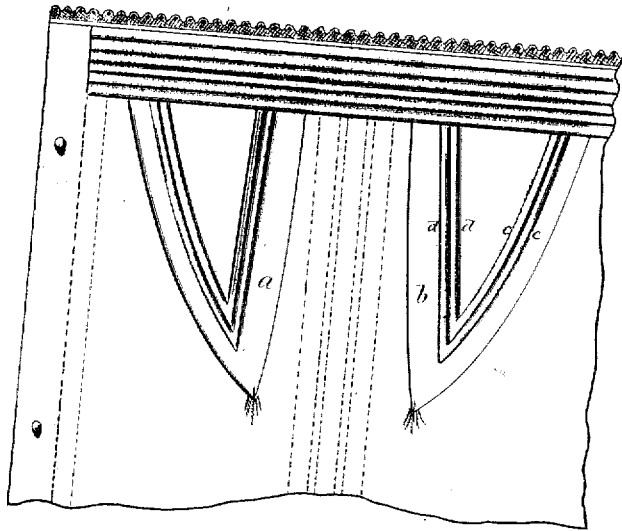

DESIGN FOR A CORSET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,713**, dated January 23, 1877; application filed December 20, 1876.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MAX ADLER, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Corsets; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a view of the breast-gores of one side of a corset.

This invention relates to an ornamental design for the breast-gores of a corset; and consists in two double lines of cord starting from near the point of the gore, and diverging from each other as they approach the top.

a b represent the two breast-gores of one side of a corset; in each of these gores a double line of cord, *c c d d*, joined near the point of the gore, and running toward the top, diverging from each other, as shown in the accompanying illustration. These lines of cord are formed by the introduction of any suitable material to represent such corded lines.

I claim—

The ornamental design for the breast-gores of corsets, consisting in the diverging double lines of cords, as herein described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
