

## DESIGN FOR PICTURE-FRAME.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,732, dated February 6, 1877; application filed June 2, 1875.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JEFFERSON J. GRAY, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and original Design for Rustic Picture-Frames, the nature of which is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration, representing the same, to which reference is made.

A A represent the body of the frame, being halved and locked together at the four corners, as usual. B B represent raised vines upon the front face of the frame, extending around upon all sides of the same, and meeting at the corners, with projecting ends, as shown, a flat surface being left at each corner, where the vines meet, which may

be further ornamented by the cut leaves, as shown, or other desirable manner.

The distinctive character of my design is found in the vines B, raised above the body portion A of the frame, as shown.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a rustic picture-frame, consisting of the raised vines B, crossing each other at right angles at the four corners, forming an ornament, substantially as shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
