


DESIGN FOR PAPER BOXES.

Specification forming part of Dosign No. 9,739, dated February 13, 1877; application filed December 26, 1876.

[Term of Patent 3] years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, NATHAN D. BILL, of Springfield, in the county of Hampden and State of Massachusetts, have originated a new Design for a Paper Box, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographs, making a part of this specification.

The base of this box is rectangular, and larger than the box at the junction-line of cover and box, with the sides and ends of the box inclining inwardly and upward toward the base of the cover above, where the size of the box is reduced to the size of the cover.

The cover rises vertically on all sides, and is about the same height as the body of the box, and the center of the sides of the box and cover are ornamented with fancy colored

figures pasted thereon, all of which is clearly shown in the photographic illustration.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a paper box in which the base is larger than the box at the junction-line of cover and box, with its sides and ends inclined inwardly and upward toward the base of the cover, the cover rising vertically above the box on all sides about an equal height with the body of the box, and the center of the sides and cover of the box being ornamented with fancy colored figures pasted thereon, all as herein shown and described.
