

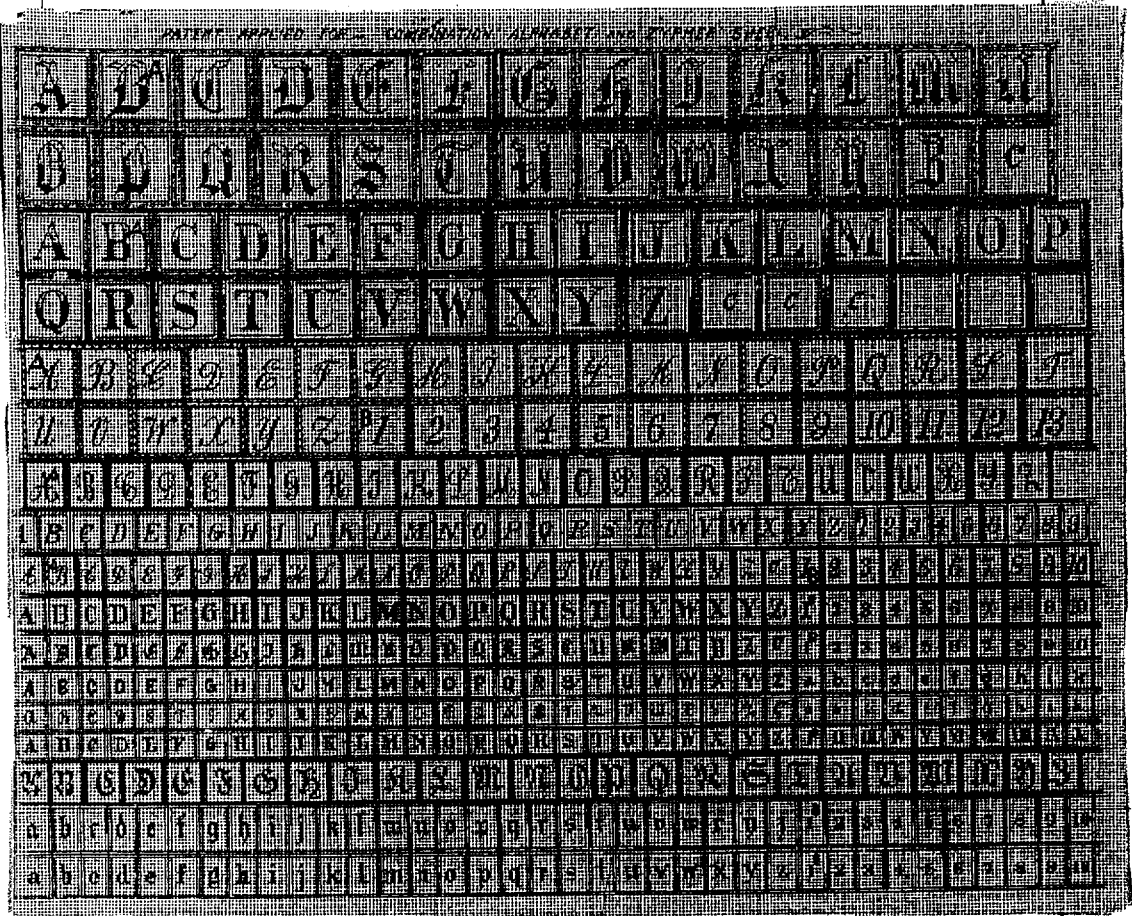

## DESIGN FOR EMBROIDERY PATTERN-SHEET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,740**, dated February 13, 1877; application filed November 20, 1876.  
[Term of Patent  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that we, BERNARD DREYFUSS and SAMUEL SACHS, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a Design for an Embroidery Pattern-Sheet, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of our design is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents a series of alphabets of different styles, and B B a series of numerals of different styles. Each letter and each numeral in the series is surrounded by a rectangular border composed of straight lines, or of a number of short curved lines, and between the adjacent sides of the squares thus formed a space is left, in the center of which a divid-

ing-line runs. At the end of each alphabet blank spaces C are left, having borders of the same size and character as those surrounding the letters.

Having thus described our invention, we claim as our design—

The design for an embroidery pattern-sheet, composed of the letters, numerals, spaces, and surrounding borders, all grouped together substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
