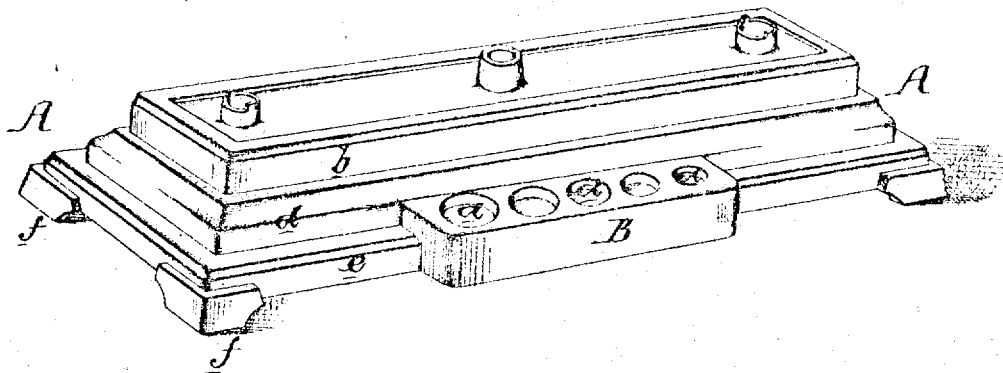

DESIGN FOR BASE FOR COUNTER-SCALES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,743, dated February 13, 1877; application filed January 10, 1877.
[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, FREDERICK W. TROEMNER, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a new and original Design for a Base for Counter-Scales, of which the following is a specification :

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying perspective drawing, in which A represents a base for counter-scales, and B a projection or ledge, formed on one side of the base, and having a number of circular orifices, *a*, of different diameters.

The base is of oblong shape, and is composed of the members *b*, *d*, and *e*, of a character

substantially as represented in the drawing, the lowermost member being furnished with feet *f*, one at each corner, as shown.

What I claim is—

The design for a base for scales, consisting of the base proper A and the ledge B, with its orifices *a*, all substantially as described.
