DESIGN FOR INDIA-RUBBER ERASERS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,746, dated February 20, 1877; application filed November 14, 1876. [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES B. DICKINson, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have originated and designed a form for India-Rubber Erasers, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying illustration, making a part of this specification.

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying illustration, to which reference is made.

A represents the body of the eraser, which consists of an elongated bar of india-rubber, or its compounds, rounded from the top to the

bottom side in a half-circle, B, at one end, and in a quarter-circle, C, at the other end. The top and bottom sides are corrugated by narrow grooves, the corrugations passing around the ends, as represented.

I claim— The design for a rubber eraser, consisting of the rectangular bar A, rounded at the corner C and end B, and provided with the corrugations, as shown and described.
