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

## DESIGN FOR AN EMBROIDERY PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,756, dated February 20, 1877; application filed February 7, 1877.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EMIL CRISAND, of New Haven, in the county of New Haven and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Embroidery Pattern; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawings, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawings constitute part of this specification, and represent a face view.

This invention relates to a design for embroidery pattern, with special reference to perforated board, the object being to indicate on the surface of the board the stitches to be taken to produce the desired pattern; and it consists in the motto and ornamentation as shown in the accompanying illustration, and hereinafter described.

The motto which forms the base of this design is "Living and Loving," the two principal words arranged one above the other on a background consisting of a bouquet of flowers, all as shown in the accompanying illustration.

I claim—

The herein-described design for embroidery-pattern, consisting of the motto "Living and Loving," arranged on a background consisting of a bouquet of flowers, as shown in the accompanying illustration.
