

RICHARD A. CULTER AND DAVID C. PROCTOR, OF PEORIA, ILLINOIS.

DESIGN FOR COOKING-STOVES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,758, dated February 20, 1877; application filed February 8, 1877.

[Term of Patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, RICHARD A. CULTER and DAVID C. PROCTOR, both of Peoria, in the county of Peoria and State of Illinois, have jointly originated and produced a Design for Cooking-Stoves, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying engraving, fully illustrating our design.

Our design consists particularly in the ornamentation of the panels of the side of the stove, and of the ornamentation of the front of the stove, the doors, and their ornaments.

The panel A, under the hearth, is a rectangular one, having a plain raised border, a, and raised scroll ornamentation b. The panel B has an arabesque bordure, c, and prominent medallion scroll-work d, and crested mantling e. The panel C has a bordure, f, similar to that in the panel B, and has a similar medallion scroll, g, but a different mantling, h, and a turban-like crest, i, as clearly shown. At either side of the upper front door D are similar mantled crested medallions k k, while the draft-ports l l are V-shaped at top and bottom, and surrounded by an ornate rectangular border, m. The false windows n n of the lower

front door E have peculiar toothed lintels o o o, and foliated panels p p p.

We claim—

1. The design for a stove, consisting of the panel A and its ornamentation shown.

2. The design for a stove, consisting of the panel B, having the ornamentation shown and described.

3. The design for a stove, consisting of the panel C, having the ornamentation described and shown.

4. The design of the upper front door D, consisting of the side medallions k, draft-ports l, and border m, substantially as described.

5. The design of the lower front door E, having false windows n n, toothed lintels o o, and foliated panels p p, substantially as described.
