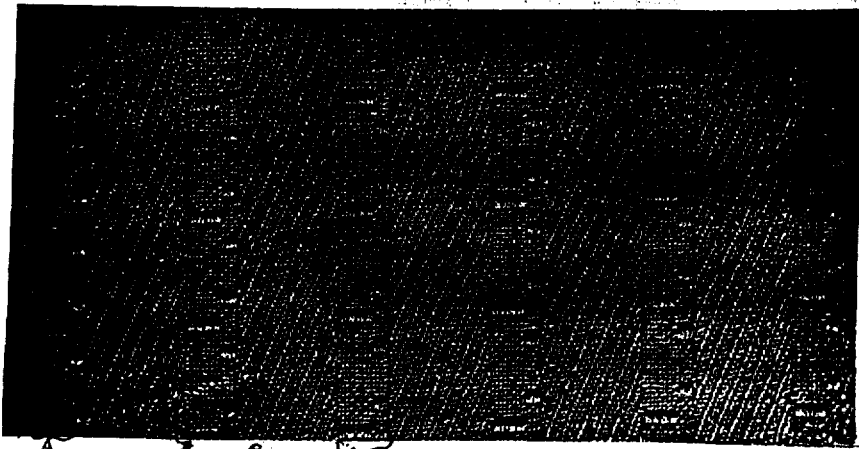

HORACE A. KIMBALL, OF PASCOAG, RHODE ISLAND.

DESIGN FOR CASSIMERE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **9,761**, dated February 27, 1877; application filed February 13, 1877.
[Term of Patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HORACE A. KIMBALL, of Pascoag, town of Burrillville, county of Providence, and State of Rhode Island, have originated and designed a Pattern for Cassimere or other Fabrics, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The body or ground of the fabric is striped with parallel longitudinal stripes A, on which, at intervals, are spots B. The spots at one edge of the stripe A extend about two-thirds of the way across said stripe, while from the other edge of the stripe A the spots extend but one-third of the way across said stripe. The smaller spots are more numerous than the larger ones, two of the former occurring

alternately to one of the latter. The parallel longitudinal stripes A are connected by diagonal twilled stripes C.

The colors of the body or ground and stripes may be varied at pleasure without departing from the spirit of my invention.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim is—

The design for cassimere, as herein shown and described.
