

DESIGN FOR CASSIMERE.

Specification forming part of Design No. 9,766, dated February 27, 1877; application filed February 13, 1877.

[Term of Patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HORACE A. KIMBALL, of Pascoag, town of Burrillville, county of Providence, and State of Rhode Island, have originated and designed a Pattern for Cassimere or other Fabrics, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The body or ground of the fabric is ornamented with stripes A and B, arranged in pairs or couplets near each other. The stripes cross each other at right angles, thus forming large checks or squares C, and small checks or squares D, and parallelograms E. Spots F are formed at the intersections of the stripes.

Diagonal twills or twilled stripes G connect the stripes A and B.

The colors of the body or ground and stripes may be varied at pleasure without departing from the spirit of my invention.

Having thus described my invention, what I claim is—

The design for cassimeres, as herein shown and described.
